Work Session

The City Council for the City of Argo met on Monday, March 9, 2026, for a work session. The meeting was held at the Municipal Complex located at 100 Blackjack Road, Argo, AL 35173.

The invocation was given by Councilperson Hopkins

The work session consisted of discussion on March 9, 2026, regular council meeting agenda.

Mayor Hettich updated the Council on the upcoming Spring Festival, scheduled for April 18, 2026. He also announced that Michelle Coalson will lead the City-Wide Clean-Up Campaign.

The Mayor asked the Council for their thoughts on purchasing shirts for Council Members to wear at city functions and conferences. The Council agreed that this would be a good idea, and it will be added to the agenda for formal approval.

The Mayor noted that Spring Break will occur during the week of March 23, 2026, and asked the Council if they would like to move the regularly scheduled March meeting to March 16, 2026. The Council expressed agreement, and the proposed change will be placed on the agenda for formal approval.

An update was provided on the ATRIP project, with the Mayor reporting that Norfolk and ALDOT are in communication. He stated that additional information will be shared with the Council as it becomes available.


The Mayor also informed the Council that the Liles Lane Extension Project is scheduled to begin on March 10, 2026, with an expected duration of two weeks.

Police Chief Alan Busler provided the Police Report for February 2026, noting a total of 508 calls. He also informed the Mayor and Council that Sgt Jack Como will be reducing his hours to weekends and court duties, and that he has hired Officer Austin Burns to fill an officer's position.

Fire Chief Scott Payne provided the Fire Department report for February 2026, noting 47 calls. He also informed the Council that the Fire Department will be testing all hydrants during the month of March.

Councilperson Griffin updated the Mayor and Council that the Business Alliance has begun accepting applications. A few individuals have already signed up, and applications are now available to interested parties.
